Ai has become a Kindergarten teacher which has only been possible because her education has been sponsored by Sharon, a local Police Officer who stepped in to minister to the needs of this deserving child at just the right time.



Dear Siloam partner in ministry

I am privileged to tell you that at the present time, Siloam sponsors 110 children in Vietnam with the help of 79 sponsors. The point of this letter is to invite you also to consider the possibility of helping a deserving child long-term in Vietnam to obtain their full God-given potential.

Siloam is one of the few licenced agencies to operate in Vietnam with the co-operation of the Vietnamese Government and the Evangelical 'Tin Lanh' church who look after the spiritual needs of our ministry. Where possible we do sponsor children from poor Christian families but also others deserving of help from Buddhists or other faiths as well as those with 'no faith' at all.

The sponsored children live in their own homes (often very poor) so your sponsorship donation also helps the entire family if required.

Sponsorship of a child currently costs £20 per month although we do invite two sponsors to partner with each other (which Siloam can arrange) who could commit to a regular donation of £10 per month.

Sponsors really find it rewarding and personally fulfilling to receive two photos and letters each year from their sponsored children and they are of course free to correspond with the children via the Siloam office as often as they wish and even send gifts directly to Vietnam if they feel moved to do so.

Siloam does not sponsor any Vietnamese children in institutions or orphanages – this is the way we prefer to work.

This leaflet features the progress made possible by Siloam's sponsorship of Tran Thi Dieu Ai showing her development until she finally left the programme in March 2017. Just look at the photos and follow the story of Ai (first names are always at the end in Vietnamese) and see what can be achieved. This young lady's sponsorship was possible because a local Police Officer Sharon, contributed to Ai's upkeep and educational expenses. We hope you too will be inspired to link up with a child in Vietnam and help them not just to survive but to succeed in life as an expression of your Christian concern.

Our ministry Director in Vietnam, Mrs Nguyen Phan Lien Ha has recently implemented a programme to improve the English language capability of the sponsored children which will help them when they embark on higher education courses and better equip them for the employment market.

If you have any questions, please do write to me so that together with Michael my Vietnamese colleague here in the office, we can answer your questions and give you all the assurance you need about how your monthly commitment will really benefit a deserving child in Vietnam.
