THANK YOU REPORT

This is what Siloam investors/donors have funded thus far, – including the new roof for the clinic.

Back in May 2021, Siloam supporters provided £9,000 to purchase a Perkins electrical generator which enables the clinic to provide a 24-hour service.

By August 2021, Siloam supporters / investors provided £4,300 to purchase a clinical waste incinerator to make waste material safe for the environment. This item was especially requested by the current **Health Authority** in Ghana. A pit was also constructed to dispose of placentas from the maternity department. Once we get our upgrade to hospital status, no doubt this disposal facility will be heavily used.

By 2022, we had become more ambitious and it became important that we replace the roof of the Siloam Gospel Clinic. This was provided at a cost of

£17,000 and included not just the roof sheets which were later painted white to help with heat reflection but also included were new joists and roof supports together with a new interior plywood ceiling covering a vast area. The ridge of the building was also elevated to provide better rainwater run-off during the tropical storms.







2023 £6,000

At the end of 2023, Siloam investors managed to purchase 25 hospital beds which have since been put to good use. The patients who previously managed on outmoded wooden hospital furniture are now grateful for those new hygienic and comfortable beds together with new mattresses which were purchased in Ghana for £6,000.



In 2024, Siloam supporters provided £6,500 with which to renovate and replace the roof and the ceiling of the visiting doctors' bungalow used by Siloam Gospel Clinic's visiting medical staff.

The inside of the visiting doctors' bungalow has also been renovated at a modest cost of £280 – ready to receive visiting surgeons and doctors once the clinic is ready to upgrade to a hospital.

December 2024,
Siloam supporters also
help provide £500 with which
to purchase an outboard motor
for the clinic's boat which is
used to visit the people in the
lagoon area which borders
The Ivory Coast.



At the beginning of 2025, Siloam provided £3,200 to urgently construct a new temporary church meeting centre which was required because the existing one was in danger of collapsing and causing physical injury. The centre will be used for Christian outreach ministry organised by the church connected to the Siloam Gospel Clinic.



This is the medical equipment we need to purchase to achieve our goal – to upgrade the clinic to that of a hospital!!







A Mindray Wato EX20 anaesthesia machine/vaporizer (Isoflurane). This is the most costly component of the proposed operating theatre equipment! This will cost £6,664.

Two surgical drums (medium) will be required costing £160 for both.





A fully equipped theatre trolley will cost £214.



An advanced drug trolley will cost £534.



A full blood count haematology analyser is required to enable the surgeon to get detailed information about each patient's blood before conducting surgery. This will cost £3,465.



An autoclave machine is required for the sterilisation of all surgical instruments before and after surgery to prevent infections being transmitted, which will cost £800.



Two air-conditioners will be required, one for the operating theatre and one for the recovery room to avoid the transmission of infections and to keep patients and the surgeons cool in a tropical environment. Each will cost £800.



Two patient monitors will be required, each costing £502



Two sets of surgical instruments, each costing £454.



A diathermy machine – 400W will cost £1,866.
