Dear Siloam giving friends and potential future investors

For 30 years visiting doctors who attend the Siloam Gospel Clinic in Ghana have been accommodated so they can perform medical procedures in this remote part of west Africa far from the major cities and towns. Over the last two years Siloam has been privileged to invest and provide funds for a new roof of the clinic which cost £17,000, a new electrical generator costing £9,000 and a waste disposal facility which keeps the local population safe and free from contamination costing £4,300. Just last year, Siloam supporters provided £6,000 to provide 25 new hospital beds which you can read more about on our 'thank you report' enclosed.

The Siloam Gospel Clinic was the vision of the 83-year-old Founder Egya-Blay who established this medical project after he had finished his study at the London Bible College. He, together with our Siloam co-workers in Germany provided initial funding so that this desperately poor rural population in southwest Ghana could be afforded this medical facility.

Siloam in the UK came to the financial rescue of the clinic after our colleagues in Germany sadly closed their operations after the death of the Founder, Rev Karl Becker many years ago.

The clinic is also a spiritual lighthouse to the local population as they know that they will be treated fairly and professionally at an affordable cost. Indeed, as much as 40% of the medical facilities in Ghana are provided by missions and charitable organisations like Siloam as the government of Ghana itself is not able to provide all the healthcare required by its growing population.

As this mission medical facility is in such a remote area, it is vitally important to provide accommodation for visiting doctors and surgeons to come and treat these vulnerable patients. The government does provide funds to pay the staff but many expenses including the refurbishment of the buildings etc... is beyond their budget.

By providing this medical outreach near the small town of Bonyere in the western region of Takoradi, Siloam is a witness to the power of Jesus Christ in this spiritually befuddled nation. There is much confusion even among existing Christians in Ghana as to the real truth of the gospel of Jesus Christ which
